Leadership Day -

Developing great student leaders

We walked into the hall, met by the smile of the lady standing at the end of the room. "Good morning everyone, my name is Paula." We made a circle and starred at each other, confusion and excited, wandering the air. She asked us about what we thought leadership was then said that we were going to dance! Two people started squealing in glee, but the other eleven of us sat there stony faced. She laughed at us, stating that most of us were not as enthusiastic when it came to making a fool of ourselves. 


