After School Care Survey

We had 12 responses to our after-school care survey.

5 of those who responded would use after-school care and 1 on a regular basis.

3 would use before-school care.

Most people thought they would pay between \$7 to \$9.

From these results, it is still not feasible to operate an after-school or before-school programme. We will continue to survey the school community on a regular basis in case the need changes.

Before and after school procedures

We have always been fairly flexible with what time children start school at Te Miro. Between 8 am and 9 am.

With the number of children arriving earlier and earlier, it is becoming more difficult for teachers to supervise and prepare for the day. The school bus students arrive at 8 am and some families have arranged with us to drop off their children at this time too so that they can get to work on time.

If you need to drop off earlier than 8:30 am, then please get in touch with the office to see if this can be an arrangement for you unless you have done so already. For all other children, please drop them off at school no earlier than 8:30 am.




Skoolloop


