Have a lovely weekend everyone! 'Ngā mihi o Matariki, te tau hou Māori'.









Rata class enjoyed listening to the fun story 'The Marble Maker'. So much so that they then made their own marble designs and described how they were made.


Rimu class have been busy designing their harakeke (flax) lanterns for the Matariki Mid Winter Festival next week.

My Grandmother

I have always known my grandmother ever since I came to New Zealand when I was very young. She has short curly black hair with a few gray hairs woven into the black and old tan skin with freckles on with a short body and long legs. Her hazel eyes shine brightly and always look tidy whenever I see her. She always wears a smile whenever we arrived at her house and always used her chirpy voice when we opened the slide door and walked in. She has very white teeth from brushing them twice a day and she always wears short sleeve T-shirts and shorts inside and always wears wet weather gear and a hat for feeding out on the farm.

I usually see my grandmother on some weekends, mostly holidays. Sometimes when we arrive at her house all we find is one empty old farmhouse and it is usually lunch time when she comes back. She is never alone because Grandad is always there with her. We kids and our cousins always see her sometime and another as well. When I come over, she doesn't seem to be sad or angry but always is bubbly and chirpy when someone like me and my brothers are staying the night. Another thing is she is really busy and hard working throughout the year; Looking after and feeding out to every animal on their 950 hectare farm. Spring was the most common. Usually after breakfast she would say to us kids " If you want to go feeding out with me then you better get ready" Just to warn us that she was going to do feeding out very soon.

My grandmother has a farmhouse up on the hill and a farm that is mostly hills rather than flat land. She always goes shopping as well on days that suit her and if there's any lowness on food. On special celebrations like Easter and Christmas day, she usually chats to family members who have come. When I come to stay over I don't really see her being angry or sad I usually see her being happy.

My grandmother has lots of respect and she doesn't seem to be strict a lot but she spoils me and my brothers when we come over to stay. She and grandad are the head of the house. Me, my brothers and my mum are always excited, happy and delighted when we go and visit her. My mum chats with her for a wee bit and has lunch afterwards to get more energy for spending time out on the farm in the afternoon.

My grandmother is always at the kitchen baking something delicious or at the table sitting on the chair having lunch or afternoon tea. The room always has two calendars, a couch, a leather armchair, a fireplace and high chairs that were used for the bench that always has lots of stuff on it.

To me I chose my grandmother because she has been a friend on the farm to me ever since I had my first sleepover. All the journeys I have been there with her, she has always made me feel like I belong with her and I have never forgotten her and her kindness and generosity. By Isla



Before School

We have always been fairly flexible with what time children start school at Te Miro. Between 8am and 9am.

With the number of children arriving earlier and earlier, it is becoming more difficult for teachers to supervise and prepare for the day. The school bus students arrive at 8am and some families have arranged with us to drop off their children at this time too so that they can get to work on time. We can not guarantee supervision of children who arrive at school early unarranged.

If you need to drop off earlier than **8.30am**, then please get in touch with the office to see if this can be arranged for you unless you have done so already. For all other children, please drop them off at school no earlier than 8.30am.

After School Care










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
