### Highlights

The years 7 & 8 had a fantastic experience at National Young Leaders Day held at the Claudelands Arena, Tuesday 16th May. This was an opportunity for the students to listen to some inspirational speakers who promoted positivity, motivation, and empowerment, to name a few key topics. For example, Brad Smeele – Former Pro Wakeboarder / Quadriplegic / Communicator inspires people worldwide with his tenacity to not only regain movement but also to live a full and action-packed life, despite his debilitating injury. Brad inspires people of all ages through his story of resilience and how he found happiness after his life-changing injury. This was a fantastic experience for our senior students. ### **Pink Shirt Day**

Te Miro School was a sea of pink/red on Friday 19th May. On Thursday, the seniors organised tie-dying tops pink or red and, on Friday, the students got to enjoy decorating pink cupcakes. Pink Shirt Day is about working together to stop bullying by celebrating diversity and promoting kindness and inclusiveness. It's about creating a community where all people feel safe, valued, and respected.



#### **Bush and Enviro Schools**

Each Friday the school goes down to the bush class. In week 2 of this term students made Mandalas with foraged items that they were going to revisit the following week to note changes. Unfortunately, they had to wait an extra week – high rain had made access to the bush unsafe for a time, so instead, in week 3, students undertook a Leaf Litter search around the school to observe decomposition in nature. The following week they got back to the bush and noted the variety of change – some mandalas had disappeared while others were still intact. We discussed Natural Cycles – that there is no waste in nature- and then searched for plant cycles (seeds, seedlings, tree, and decomposing leaves), followed by an epic fungi hunt! The Enviro group then headed back up to the smaller school bush area to set up their tradescantia eradication experiment. Practising Kaitiakitanga, they are looking at the best way to care for the bush and remove pest plants. This week they marked off two squares – one covered by black plastic and one introduced with Tradescantia yellow spot leaf fungus, a biocontrol agent that they heard about from mahi at other Enviroschools. These are the 'slow' methods they are investigating and next week the 'fast methods' of hand-pulling the weed, and introducing chickens, will get underway. While tackling an environmental issue students are learning about the scientific method – starting with a question, creating a hypothesis and undertaking an experiment.
