# Kowhai

This week Kowhai class have been reflecting on their Matariki wishes for the year to come.



### Matariki

Our annual Midwinter Matariki Celebration is coming up in a few weeks. During this lovely nighttime event, your tamariki (children) will have made a lantern and will take you on a journey through the bush area to look at brightly lit grottos made by tamariki. To prepare for this, we ask if you can possibly supply lights (fairy lights, little solar or battery candles or candles in a jar). They need more light than you know. The children will create their natural grotto at school ready for the event. After the performances and the lantern walk, we all gather in the kitchen to devour some yummy soups provided by our wonderful PTA and whoever else is prepared to make some. It is a time to gather and be grateful for all of the wonderful relationships, whanau and memories we have. We hope you can all make it.



# **Curriculum Focus - Pepeha**

All of our tamariki have been learning how to introduce themselves in Māori. Ask them to show you.

Tamariki have been learning their school mihi/pepeha-the traditional Māori way of introducing ourselves. For Māori, saying mihi/pepeha is an important way of making connections with others and understanding more about where a person is from.

Ko Maungatautari ko Maungakawa ngaa maunga Maungatautari is my Mountain and Maungakawa is the hill
Ko Waikato te awa - Waikato is the river
Ko Ngati Haua te iwi - Ngati Haua is the Māori tribe
Ko Te Miro toku kura - Te Miro is my school
Ko \_\_\_\_\_\_(my name) ahau - My name is \_\_\_\_

The names mihi and pepeha have some differences-a mihi is shared by someone who is non-Māori, and a pepeha is shared by somebody who is Māori. Within both mihi/pepeha, we acknowledge the mountain and river we identify most with, where we come from and where we live now, who our whānau are, and finally our name. When we can all confidently recite our school mihi/pepeha, we can have a go at learning our own. Some of us already know it.


